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Innsbruck - Bolzano

THE CLASSIC ON ADIGE CYCLE PATH.

In eight days through Tyrol! On this trip with Eurobike there is not only a lot to see, but it also leads through two countries: Austria and Italy. Along the cycle path on Italy's second longest river, the Adige, it is mountainous at first. With every kilometre cycled south, the atmosphere becomes more Mediterranean. Whether Innsbruck and Imst on the Austrian side or Merano and Bolzano in Italy - enjoy the beautiful cities after the physical activity in nature!

Details of the route from Innsbruck to Bolzano

Start the tour in the world-famous Innsbruck with views of the Hafelekar on one side and the Bergisel ski jump and Patscherkofel in the opposite direction. On the way to the first stage destination, don't miss the view of the Cistercian Abbey of Stams and go in search of the origin of the famous operetta "Die Vogelhändler" in Imst.

After a climb up the Resia Pass, the famous Lake Resia including the church spire in the water awaits with fascinating views. On day 4, the route leads past majestic castles and palaces to beautiful Merano, which can be discovered in detail on day 5 - of course, several alternatives are available for the rest day. Finally, along the South Tyrolean Wine Road, Bolzano awaits with its extraordinary architecture.

Highlights of the 8-day tour from Innsbruck to Bolzano


- The Golden Roof in Innsbruck: 2,657 shingles make up the famous landmark in the capital of Tyrol. Did you know? But they are not made of gold, but fire-gilded copper. Not only the Golden Roof is worth a visit, but also the lively Innsbruck city centre that surrounds it.
- Magnificent panorama of the Ortler: "King Ortler" is enthroned in the Vinschgau Valley at 3,905
 metres but that's not the only thing that's impressive. Around 100 glaciers are located in the
 mountain massif of the group. Soak up the magnificent views along the route, especially on day 4.

- **South Tyrolean wine at Lake Kaltern:** First treat yourself to a swim in Lake Caldaro, which is one of the warmest in the Alps thanks to its shallow average depth of around four metres. Afterwards, why not treat yourself? How about a hearty 'jause' at a wine producer alongside a taste of the palatable South Tyrolean wines?
- **Stroll through the Laubengasse in Bolzano:** Enjoy a cappuccino at Walther Square with a view of the cathedral then stroll through the "Via dei Portici" and look for souvenirs to take back home if that's not a worthy conclusion to this cycle tour, what is?

Useful information about the cycling tour with Eurobike

The Inn and Adige valleys offer wonderful views along the tour, which has stages between 35 and 65 km. The stages up to the Resia Pass in particular require a good basic level of fitness, from then on it's downhill for long stretches. There are various options for shortening the tours, including using the Vinschgau railway.

Arrival in Innsbruck

Welcome briefing and bike fitting. We then recommend that you visit Innsbruck's famous old town with its City Tower and its "Golden Roof".

Sample hotel: Austria Trend Congress



Innsbruck – Imst

approx. 65 km

You will cycle along the former towpath along the river Inn, at the foot of Martinswand (mountain face) and through little villages and market towns to Stams (baroque Cistercian convent). Then, you will continue your tour via Haiming to Imst, the so-called "Merano of North Tyrol".

Sample hotel: Hirschen



Imst - San Valentino/Burgusio/Malles

approx. 50 km + bus transfer

Today, you will cycle along the river Inn, past the monastery Zams to Landeck. A bus will take you to Nauders from where you will cycle less than 100 metres in altitude uphill to the mountain pass Reschen<u>Resia</u> pass. From there, you will cycle downhill to Lake Reschen<u>Resia</u>see and continue on minor roads to Mals<u>Malles</u> (many towers in the centre) or to Burgeis<u>Burgusio</u> at the foot of the castle Marienburg.

Sample hotel: Garni Zum Hirschen



San Valentino/Burgusio/Malles – Merano

approx. 65 km

Your day starts with a trip to Glurns (perfectly preserved medieval city walls). Then, you will cycle via the Montani ruins, through Schlanders Silandro, down to Merano. On your way, you will come across some pretty castles (mountaineer Reinhold Messner's castle Juval) and you will get marvellous views of the impressive mountain massif Ortlermassiv and the mountain pass Stilfserjoch. Since 2004, the Venosta train has been operating again between MalsMalles and Merano. You can almost always take this train to travel a part of your journey.

Sample hotel: Villa Laurus



Passeiertal/Merano approx. 40 km

On the fifth day, you will have the opportunity to ride your bike into the Passeiertal valley to the Sandwirt inn (birthplace of the Tyrolean freedom fighter Andreas Hofer). Alternatively, you can hike on the famous Tappeiner trail or go shopping at the famous arcades of Merano.

Sample hotel: Villa Laurus



Merano − Auer approx. 50 km

Today's stage will take you via Lana (Schnatterpeck Altar) and through numerous orchards and vineyards in the area of the South Tyrolean Wine Road, past many fortresses, castles and ruins such as Hocheppan (famous frescos) to Lake Kalterer See. You will spend your night in the cosy wine town Auer.

Sample hotel: Kaufmann



Auer-Bozen approx. 35 km

Leaving the charming wine town behind you, you will cycle on flat routes through the Adige valley or via the Montiggler lakes (scenic, but more demanding route), past Sigmundskron to Bolzano (arcades, "Ötzi" museum).

Sample hotel: Laurin



Departure or extension

It would be nice to continue for another few days... Well, that's possibly. You can extend the tour nicely to Venice or Verona from here.

Tour character

You will cycle on bike paths in the river valleys of the Inn and Adige rivers. A bus will take you from Landeck to Nauders. From there you will cycle uphill 70 metres in altitude until you reach Resia pass (mountain pass).

Afterwards, you can enjoy cycling downhill for more than 1,200 metres in altitude to Bolzano. In order to stay on calm roads, cycling some small climbs will be necessary.
